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GRADE 8 ART COURSE SYLLABUS

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Grade 8 Art engages the students into an immersive exploration of various forms of visual arts, emphasizing foundational skills in drawing, painting, relief sculpture, and in-the-round sculpture.

Throughout the academic year, students are immersed in both historical and contemporary approaches to these art forms, fostering creativity, technical proficiency, and critical thinking. The course covers the fundamentals of drawing and painting in terms of techniques, materials, color theory, and painting techniques in quarter 1 and quarter 2. Form, texture, materials, process, depth, spatial relationships, and storytelling are explored through relief sculpture, and the full three-dimensionality of sculpture in Quarter 4.

Grade 8 Art provides students with comprehensive preparation for drawing, painting, relief sculpture, and in-the-round sculpture, encouraging them to explore their artistic interests and develop skills that will serve as a foundation for future artistic endeavors.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- Drawing: Develop significant standards of progressing drawing skills through exercises in line, form, shading, and composition. Explore still life, figure drawing, and perspective techniques.
- Painting: Introduce students to the advanced principles of color theory, brush techniques, and various
 painting styles as well as the psychological uses of color and expression. Explore advanced use of
 acrylics, watercolors, and mixed media to challenge their creative interpretations.
- Relief Sculpture: Study the basics of relief sculpture, focusing on creating three-dimensional forms on a two-dimensional surface. Learn carving techniques using materials such as clay, wood, or plaster.
- Sculpture: Delve into the world of sculpture by exploring different sculpting techniques and materials: from modeling with clay to carving stone or assembling found objects, students will create both abstract and figurative scul¹ptures. Experience the materiality of 3-d works.
