COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Grade 12 Community Service Project serves as the culminating course for the Dominican International School's community service program. The course continues to focus on four significant areas of growth and development namely: (1) promotion of life, (2) health and wellness, (3) integrity of creation/environmental awareness/care, and (4) language & other literacies. By instilling a sense of social responsibility among DIS students, not only do they achieve holistic development but most importantly, they grow to become preachers of Grace. As they get intertwined with the mission started by St. Dominic, they become witnesses of Truth and agents passing a better world to the next generation. On the theoretical aspect, this course shall provide discussions on pressing concerns which help understand increasingly complex issues.

The course follows the Salamanca Process as a framework for learning. Specifically, the framework calls for a synergy between the Dominican intellectual and apostolic life by directing study, research, analysis and action towards addressing the challenges that the world faces (Salamanca Congress Final Document, 2016). The daily routine entails study (interaction phase), research (clarification phase), analysis (questioning phase), and action (design phase). This holistic approach guides Dominicans as they carry the torch invigorating the world wherever they go.

COURSE OBJECTIVES AND CONTENTS: SWBAT

- inculcate among students a sense of compassion to the needs of the society.
- guide the students to channel their sense of responsibility towards the common good.
