PERSONALITY AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT 8 (PSD)

GRADE LEVEL: 8

SCHOOL YEAR: 2024-2025

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COURSE DESCRIPTION:

In this Personality Social Development course, the students will be able to know themselves better. Middle school is a time where students face different challenges. Adolescence period is typically a time of great stress and strain on the body, mind and emotions. This class aims to help students to cope with emotional challenges and help them to feel equipped to take care of their emotional needs.

Emotional well-being can be defined as "one's ability to relate to other people, feel comfortable with self, cope with disappointments and stress, solve problems, celebrate successes and make decisions" (Page and Page, 1992). Emotional well-being is built upon the foundation of a positive and healthy self-esteem. This can be achieved when a child gets to know himself more, appreciates his good qualities and is aware of his strengths and weaknesses.

This course starts with a basic introduction of personality. It then goes on to look at theories of personality development. They will learn about their own personality and how they can use that information to make changes and career choices. They will learn all these and also learn how to put all the information together to use it for their personal or career advantage.

In this course, students can literally stop wondering about why they or someone they know behave a particular way. By the time they complete this course they will know how someone's personality develops and how that information can be useful.

This course is especially helpful for those who are striving to learn more about who they are, which direction their life should take, and to learn more about others around them.
