#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

Religious Studies provides an integral formation for the RS 1 students to become a valuable and constructive member of society by offering God-centered education and inculcating the Dominican ideals: love of study, prayer, community, and service to others.

The first graders embark on an exciting journey where students will understand and practice Universal and Christian values. They will reflect spiritually, think ethically, make good decisions and grow in faith. We seek for students to develop deep knowledge, understanding and skills to grow according to God's will in the world around them.

Throughout the course students will enrich and nurture their spiritual development through prayer, faith formation and social sharing activities. Students will see and learn the beauty and goodness of creation, understand that Jesus wants to be their friend and that he welcomes everyone into his kingdom.

# COURSE OBJECTIVES AND CONTENTS: (SWBAT) Students will be able to:

**WORD:** Through the Sacred Scripture's immersion, RS1 students will understand that God speaks and invites them to be more like Jesus. It will help them discover that listening carefully to the Scripture readings keep them in touch with God and his plan for their lives. They will be able to identify that everything that surrounds them (family, school and communities) will be impacted and lead them to develop a meaningful connection and love with one another. The Bible will help them have a deep understanding about Jesus and his followers.

**WITNESS:** RS 1 students will understand that the mission of Christians is to help, love and serve others. They will realize how Church members care for one another, pray together, share, and help those in need. Through Jesus' examples, they learn how to act like the first Christians, open their hearts and minds of those around them to Christ. They will demonstrate by words, actions and behavior what they experienced by reaching out to others and bringing them closer to Christ.

**WORSHIP:** Enhancing faith formation will be reflected in worship for our students. RS 1 students will come to a fuller understanding of the Church's liturgy and enable them to participate more fully in it through different kinds of prayers, including some of the prayers prayed by the worshiping assembly during the liturgy. Students will experience praying with God's word as a way of getting closer to Jesus and worship him by loving and serving others.
