GRADE LEVEL: 8

SCHOOL YEAR: 2024-2025

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COURSE DESCRIPTION:

"And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." (Matthew 16:18)

Grade 8 Religious Studies will engage the students to understand the foundations of the Church as found in the textbook/workbook while simultaneously anchoring the students on the three Pillars of the Campus Ministry Department: Word, Witness, and Worship. "Word" focuses on the doctrines and teachings, especially found in the Catholic Church. "Witness" is the application of the concepts learned. "Worship" is the celebration of faith while respecting the individuals' conscience. The harmony of these three pillars will help to ensure holistic formation of the students. The students will be encouraged to read the Holy Bible in a prayerful manner while also learning how to read it in an academic manner.

In addition, students will be challenged to critically think about what they learned and to apply it to their own lives. They should have reasons for what they believe, supported with logic. Students are encouraged to share truthfully with the class their own beliefs and opinions while respecting every individual that they encounter, despite their race, class, sexual orientation, etc. This will be measured through the D'TORCH values (truthful, organized, reflective, courageous, helpful).

Finally, the purpose of this course is to assist the students in their everyday life and challenge them to be the best versions of themselves. The students will be challenged to find their meaning and purpose in life and to courageously live out their heart's desires. Students are called to never give up, daily seeking to become a better person. Christian faith and Christian Living are rooted in the person of Jesus Christ and through him the way to God's Kingdom is attained. In this course, the supplementary lessons

will also be included like Liturgical celebrations and Dominican Saints who are models of values/virtues.

COURSE OBJECTIVES AND CONTENTS: (SWBAT) Students will be able to: WORD:

- 1. learn the development of the Magisterium from the apostolic, Trinitarian roots of the early Church;
 - 2. understand that the pope has the authority and responsibility to lead and guide the universal Church:
 - 3. recognize that Christ is present in the sacramental life of the Church;
 - 4. describe reasons that the Euhcarist is the central act of worship in the Church;
 - 5. define the word "catholic" and describe a disagreement in the early Church over the catholic nature of the Church.

WITNESS:

- 1. recall that each member of a group assumes certain responsibilities to achieve common goals;
- 2. offer ways to carry out the apostolic mission of the Church in today's world;
- 3. understand that we grow in holiness through our participation in the Sacraments and the liturgy;
- 4. understand that there are many ways to express our faith and show God's love to others:
- 5. reflect on Pope Francis' explanation of the meaning of catholic, and to consider the gifts that enrich the Church;
- 6. offer ways that we can reflect the catholic nature of our Church and promote the common good;
- 7. respond to the challenges of spreading the Gospel in the world today.

- 1. pray the Apostle's Creed;
- 2. participate actively during Masses;
- 3. pray a prayer of intercession for the good of the Church, society, and the world.
