### Parts of a Plant (Science) Gr 4 Ms. Rachel

We studied the shape and form of celery stalks. Students looked for the parts of a plant, i.e., roots, stems and leaves, and studied the tubes inside the celery using magnifying glasses.

Students studied the transportation of nutrients in celery stalks through the movement of colored water. Food coloring was used so as not to damage the plant. We observed that the leaves of the plants turned red, making it obvious that plants carry water from the roots to the stem and then to the leaves, from the intensity of the redness in different parts of the celery stalk.

October is the Month traditionally dedicated to the Holy Rosary. Our Grade 2 students created a giant paper rosary to explore this form of prayer used in the Catholic Church.

The objectives of the Guidance Office was to give DIS students the opportunity to learn about specific occupations and the importance of the subjects they study in school. The Guidance Office wants to encourage the students to follow their dreams, live their passion and pursue their happiness in choosing their career path.

Career Week started with a Career Fashion Show. Students dressed up in the outfits of their dream career. They dressed up like lawyers, teachers, movie stars, singers, cheerleaders, football players, nurses, doctors, and many others.

The lower school students also had mini field trips throughout the week. For their min field trip, the Grade 5 students went to the local police station to see what a policeman's job is like and what a police station looks like.
