On 22 May, Anthony Wu, our award-winning Grade I2 pianist gave a piano recital in the gym. It was a true pleasure to watch such an accomplished pianist perform. Anthony is the winner of many national and international competitions. Amongst others, he won First Prize in the 2016 Japan Hamamatsu International Piano Competition, First Prize in the 2016 National Taiwan Piano Competition, 2nd Prize in 2014 Japan International Classical Music Competition, and he was a Finalist in the 2016 Steinway and Son International Piano Competition, to mention just a few.

He started the recital with J. S. Bach's Italian Concerto in F major BWV 971t. Mvt. 1. This was followed with the well-known sounds of Beethoven's Moonlight Sonata. After the soulful Beethoven performance, he showed his superior technique with Chopin's Andante Spianato Et Grande Polonaise Brillante Op. 22.

Bach enthusiasts had a special surprise when Anthony's class mate, Hiro Fu gave him a short break from the piano when he performed Cello Suite No.1 v Menuet . Then Anthony was back at the grand piano, showing the audience how to play Chopin's Nocturne in D flat major Op.27 No.2. The grand finale was Franz Liszt's "Taramtella" from Venezia e Napoli. Anthony thanked the school for his years at DIS, but we thanked him for a piano recital of international standard in our own gym.

The 7th NIFISA (NIFS International Sports Academy) was held successfully from 28th, Februaryto 9th of March 2018 at NIFS (National Institute of Fitness and Sports) in Kanoya, Japan. Fifteen professors of NIFS conducted the lectures, where courses provided a curriculum on Olympic Education, Sports Performance, Sports Science, Sports Nutrition, Sport Coaching, Sports Physiology, Japanese Martial Arts, Language and Homestay program and much more. Moreover, the participants were able to present and share their creative and innovative ideas on Sports Research. It was a wonderful opportunity for NIFISA participants, NIFS students and professors to exchange state-of-the-art information and facts with each other.
